Mayor Berlin opened the meeting at 6:50 PM.

Mayor Berlin welcomed everyone to the hearing for Status of Funded Activities.

Mayor Berlin invited Taci Stoddard with Altura to speak.

Taci said she would be reporting on the status of the Mustang Park Improvement Project. She reported that this hearing was scheduled to be held at the end of the project but that the restrooms have been delayed. The company building the restrooms is awaiting approval from the State inspectors. The plans must be approved by the State as the building is manufactured (built offsite).

The amount of the grant for the project was originally \$250,000 but was increased by \$20,000 for a total of \$270,000.

Activity Status:

- Restroom have been delayed and waiting state approval.
- Knife River has begun prep-work for the paving the pathway.
- Rocky Mountain power has been paid and are working with Keller to move the power pole.
- City has been completing in-kind work for the water.

Taci presented council with budget sheets that show breakdown of payouts to date.

Taci said that the estimated close out date is mid-September.

The proposed beneficiaries are the residence of the City of Roberts.

Questions and comments can be taken for five (5) days following this hearing. Comments will be responded to in writing within 15 days business days. Grant application can be reviewed at City Hall during regular business hours.

The funding for this project if from Community Development Block Grant come from the State of Idaho from the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development. These funds are currently being used to improve Mustang Park by adding restrooms, parking, lighting, and ADA accessibility.

Taci asked if there were any questions.

Karol Poston asked if the pathway was just for an entrance to the restrooms.

Taci said that the pathway would connect the bathrooms to the path that already exists. It will also connect the shelters to the pathway.

Mayor Berlin closed the Public Hearing at 6:59 PM.
